Children's Centre Development and Activities

Re-roofing of the Children's Centre

Efforts to re-roof the Children's Centre have not yet yielded the desired result. The ceiling has collapsed on the activity wing side and window and door frames are seriously affected by termites. The problem has continued in spite of a major fumigation carried out last year and repeated efforts to get repairs. Fortunately, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. B.C. Ozumba has again approved re-roofing of the building and efforts are being made to ensure release of funds to save this university building from collapse. Our thanks to the Vice-Chancellor; our Patron, Pharm. (Mrs.) Chinelo Ozumba; and UWA President Prof. Ifeyinwa Achike for their sustained efforts with regard to re-roofing the building and repairing the wall.

Building and grounds maintenance

Cleaners from the task force continued to clean the building, thanks to our Patron, Pharm. (Mrs.) Chinelo Ozumba. Maintaining the grounds was a challenge, as the environmental task force was unable to clear the grass with sufficient regularity and the Centre no longer has a gardener to tend the flowers and hedges around the building.

Christmas caroling 2016

In the year under consideration, annual caroling took place only in Zones IV & Mbonu Ojike/ Murtala Mohamed/Glen Taggart/King Jaja Streets and Zone VI & Ukuta Close, yielding a total of N34,500.00. Our heartfelt thanks go to zonal coordinators Mrs. Beatrice Ewa for Zone IV and Dr. Amaka Okafor for Zone VI. Efforts are being made to recruit more volunteers in the various zones for the 2017 carolling.

World book day.

This was celebrated on March 1, 2017 in collaboration with the American Corner Enugu. Children's Centre Committee members Ngozi Osadebe, Grace Onyebuchi, Elizabeth Babarinde, Yemi Fagbemi and Evangel Obim shared stories with children in nearby primary schools, including Onuiyi Primary School (*Twins in Trouble*), Central P. S. (*The Sea Cave*), Agu Achara P.S. (*Sabakula and the Monster Egg*), and Model P. S. (*Danger in the Lake*). They also visited other schools, including one for children with special needs, to brief them on World Book Day and suggest various activities such as group reading and maker spaces. Prof. Nancy Achebe and Prof. Felix Ekere conducted a phone-in at Lion FM, monitoring and reporting reading activities in the schools. Students of Library and Information Science led by Tony Izuchukwu rolled out their drums, marching round the campus to create awareness of

the celebration. At the University Library they were addressed by University Librarian Prof. Chinwe Ezeani on the importance of reading.

Prison outreach

Nsukka Prison: Two sets of shelves were made for the prison library, thanks to Prof. Virginia Dike, and the collection is now better accommodated for easy use. During the session, a team from the Children's Centre and Department of Library and Information Science introduced a programme for literacy development through comic book writing. The team consisted of Grace Onyebuchi, Elizabeth Babarinde, Tony Izuchukwu, Ify Obim and Yemi Fagbemi, while the welfare officer in charge of the library, Mr. Joseph Onah, organized the selection of the initial group of 15 inmates. Participants were taught how to create a comic book from start to finish—developing the story and characters, creating the graphics and dialog, and plotting the story in panels. Other literacy activities included writing pocket book biographies in pairs and making book marks. This programme is ongoing.

Awka Prison: ZODML (Zaccheus Onumba Dibiaezue Memorial Libraries), an NGO based in Lagos, donated six standard library shelves filled with a good variety of books to Awka and Onitsha prisons. These were commissioned on March 30, 2017. Jill Dike also visited Aguata Prison to see the room allocated for their library and to discuss steps for developing it. She gave comics and National Geographic Magazines donated through the Children's Centre. Plans are underway for a trainers' workshop for the four prisons in Anambra State (Awka, Onitsha, Nnewi and Aguata) before the end of 2017.

Saturday Activities

In the current session (Oct. 2016- Sept, 2017), Saturday story hour did not take place due to lack of personnel. Providing vibrant Saturday activities will be a challenge taken up in the new session.

Children's Day Celebration

The Children's Day celebration talk on "Growing Up Responsibly" was given by Prof A. E Agwu of the Faculty of Agriculture, UNN. The talk touched all aspects of adolescent life, including body changes, emotions, peer pressure, digital technology use, relationships and family living. It was held at UBA Hall of Fame. Turn-out for the event was low, with only 65 children attending, and many were under age 10. As a result, the UWA President, Prof. Ifeyinwa Achike requested that the talk be rescheduled and advertised widely to attract the expected audience of secondary school age children.

Long Vacation Programme

The long vacation programme took place from August 3 to Sept. 5, 2017 with 25 children registered. Most were primary school children. Fees were N3,000 for kindergarten age and N2,000 for primary and secondary. The programme was publicized through flyers sent to schools on and off campus and announcements in churches. Activities included sports of many types--volley ball, handball, football, Ludo, cards, Scrabble, chess and puzzle solving, as well as crafts like beading, weaving and shoe making. The decision to include preparation of local dishes in the programme could not be realized because the decision was taken late. Committee members participating were Ngozi Osadebe, Elizabeth Babarinde, Meg Ngwuchukwu and Grace Onyebuchi.

Website & Social Media

A sub-committee convened by Helen Okpala, with Grace Onyebuchi, Ify Obim, Elizabeth Babarinde, Chizoba Oranu and Ngozi Osadebe as members, revitalized the Centre's facebook page and arranged for rebuilding and updating of the website. The sum of N70,000 was approved for this purpose and the new website is almost ready for uploading.

Children's Centre Library

Registration – In 2016/2017, there were 86 new registrations and 26 renewals.

Collection Development - Books accessioned increased from 19,491 to 19,565 with 74 new books added to the register.
